

Lots of short pieces of fun information presented in kid-friendly fonts and colors with web-links for advance research. She and her Mom had seen some of the suggested sites on tv programs and were excited to plan their trip using suggestions from the book. Mom found the book to be great for planning your way around the city with just a few days to spend in it. Since the book features the highlights of DC, she could focus on what a 10 yr. old would want to see and figure out what they could fit in.Before retirement I worked as a public librarian and based book selections on their appeal to a wide audience, as well as their visual look and content.
