Bond continues wire walker Jules story (*GIRL ON A WIRE*) in this first of 4 comics that take Jules and the circus team to Paris. After loving both *GIRL ON A WIRE* and *GIRL IN THE SHADOWS*, it was amazing to see the characters in comic form. The designs are fantastic. I especially love the spooky panels when the big mystery is set up towards the end. I did 4 stars instead of 5 because some of the facial expressions were drawn a little strangely and almost look like wax at times, but that was definitely only for a few panels, not the majority.

First off, I have never read a graphic novel. I didn't even enjoy comic books as a kid. This Girl Over Paris was magical. It sucked me in until the last page where the words, "to be continued" were written. In my haste to read one of Ms. Bond's work I never saw that it was part of a series. Now I am dangling like the proverbial ingenious tightrope walker helplessly waiting for the next installment.
