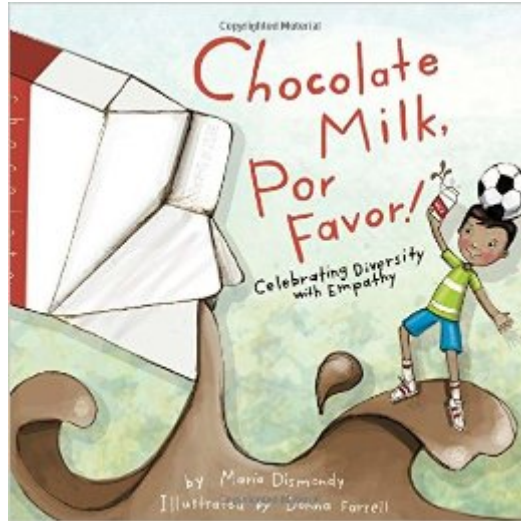

Because this is a presidential election year households are viewing/listening to more news coverage than ever. Children notice the argumentative attitude displayed by many of the "talking heads" delivering their personal spin on the latest political firestorm. Although children don't truly comprehend what is happening they certainly recognize the angry tenor of the discussions. Many kids worry about how these events will affect them, their families, communities and our country. These books address the experience of immigration and do a wonderful job of fostering empathy and recognizing the courage required to begin a new life whether in a foreign country or in a new family. *Chocolate Milk, Por Favor* written by Maria Dismody and charmingly illustrated by Donna Farrell, presents the story primarily from Johnny's point of view. He fears being displaced as his class "makes room" a new student; Readers also see Gabe's perspective as the new student. Johnny acts out his fears through hostility but his classmates follow their teacher's suggestion and help him learn how to fit in. While Gabe and Johnny do not speak the same

language, they do share a love of soccer. Sport succeeds in breaking down barriers and mistrust. I like how this book depicts many different reactions to the immigrant student's arrival. This feels more believable. It also shows how Gabe and his classmates strive to communicate even though they don't speak one another's language. What they have in common "as kids, students and soccer players" outweighs the differences that divide them. The book is based on the experiences of one of Maria Dismony's students. This is a wonderful story because it portrays the situation from both sides.
